- There is only one form of *you* in English, which is the same in singular and plural.
- VERB ROOT except for the third person singular, which takes en -s
- Note the endings with he, she, and it. If the verb ends in ss, sh, ch, or x, add es:

He finishes (finish ends in sh)

She watches (watch ends in ch)

USE

- **a) To talk about things in general** (to say that something happens all the time or is true in general, no matter whether the action is happening at the moment of speaking), It is used *for general statements of fact*.:
 - Eg. Water consists of hydrogen and oxygen.

The Earth goes round the sun.

- **b)** When we say how often we do things, for repeated or habitual actions(to express *habitual or everyday activity*) with frequency adverbs.
 - Eg. I study for two hours every night.

I get up at 8.00 every morning.

Anne doesn't often drink.

c) With future reference (generally used with timetables)

Eg. The concert begins at 7.30 and ends at 9.30

The plane leaves at 7.25.

The Prime Minister comes next week.

- **d)** Certain verbs are not used in the progressive tenses. With these verbs, the simple present may indicate a situation that exists right now, at the moment of speaking.
- **Eg**. I have only a dollar right now. He needs a pen right now.
