## **Expressions of the Day**

- **A.** The word *help* comes to be used in a number of idiomatic expression. An idiomatic expression refers to an expression whose meanings cannot be inferred from the meanings of the words that make it up<sup>1</sup>.
- 1. I cannot help it: This expression means it is not possible for you to stop something. In Arabic, it may be translated into شيء أقوى مني and in French "c'est plus fort que moi."
  - A: Can't you stop laughing? You are going to embarrass yourself!
  - B: Sorry, I *cannot help it*. The situation is so funny I *cannot help* laugh*ing*.
- 2. *Help yourself*: This expression is used to say that you can serve yourself to something.
  - A: Can I help myself to another piece of this Black Forest Gateau?
  - B: Be my guest. And why don't you *help yourself to* these pancakes as well?
    - "Help yourself to these hands as you go out." The teacher said.
