Lecture : So That/ such That

1)- So That:

We use so...that, such...that: to show a fact (usually with a result or consequence)

<u>Eg</u> : I was **so** sleepy **that** I couldn't keep my eyes open.

► So.... That _____ used with **adjectives** and **adverbs**.

So + adjective /adverb + that + result

Examples:

- Cause: It was too windy
- So That : it was <u>so</u> windy <u>that</u> we could not go sailing .(windy is an adjective).

Sothat

-Cause: My sister is very shy.

- Effect: We could not go sailing

-Effect: She hides behind my mother when there are strangers around.

• My sister is <u>so shy that</u> she hides behind my mother when there are strangers around. (shy is an adjective).

-Cause: The dress was wonderfully de	rsigned ך

-Effect: I couldn't take my eyes off it.	J	

► The dress was <u>so</u> wonderfully designed <u>that</u> I couldn't take my eyes off it. (wonderfully- adverb).

2)- SuchThat :

Such Also expresses a cause and effect.

Such + (adjective) + noun + that

Examples:

-Cause: It was a great movie	٦	
	}	SuchThat
-Effect: I watched it several times	J	

It was <u>such</u> a great movie <u>that</u> i watched it several times. (great-adjective, movie-noun).

-Cause: She is a very charming woman.-

-Effect: Everybody stares at her.

She is <u>such</u> a charming woman <u>that</u> everybody stares at her. (Charming-adjective, woman-noun)

SuchThat

Note: such a very charming... "very" is dropped.

Attention:

► So...that is used with quantifiers (many, much, few, little) even if there is a noun.

► I have so many friends that I never get bored.

► He has **so** <u>much</u> money **that** he can buy whatever he wants.
