1) - So.... That:

We use so...that, such...that: to show a fact (usually with a result or consequence)

Eg: I was so sleepy that I couldn't keep my eyes open.

► So.... That used with **adjectives** and **adverbs**.

So + adjective /adverb + that + result

Examples:

- Cause: It was too windy

So That : it was \underline{so} windy \underline{that} we could not

- Effect: We could not go sailing

go sailing .(windy is an adjective).

-Cause: My sister is very shy.

Sothat

-Effect: She hides behind my mother when there are strangers around-

► My sister is <u>so shy that</u> she hides behind my mother when there are strangers around. (shy is an adjective).

-Effect: I couldn't take my eyes off it.

So ...that

► The dress was **so** wonderfully designed **that** I couldn't take my eyes off it. (Wonderfully- adverb).

2)- SuchThat:

Such Also expresses a cause and effect.

Examples:

-Cause: It was a great movie

SuchThat
-Effect: I watched it several times

It was <u>such</u> a great movie <u>that</u> i watched it several times. (Great-adjective / movie-noun).

-Cause: She is a very charming woman.

SuchThat

-Effect: Everybody stares at her.

She is <u>such</u> a charming woman <u>that</u> everybody stares at her. (Charming-adjective, woman-noun)

Note: such a very charming... "very" is dropped.

Attention:

- ► So...that is used with quantifiers (many, much, few, little) even if there is a noun.
- ► I have so <u>many</u> friends that I never get bored.
- ► He has **so** <u>much</u> money **that** he can buy whatever he wants.

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
