# BASE WORD

A base word is the most **basic** form of a word that is able to describe something or to carry a meaning.

A root word is similar to a base word, but it comes from another language, usually **Greek** or **Latin**. A root word often needs a prefix or a suffix attached to it to make sense.

# AFFIX

Affixes are word parts that change the meaning of a root/base word. **Prefixes** and **suffixes** are both **affixes**.

# PREFIX

A prefix is a letter or group of letters added to the **beginning** of a word to make a new word.

A letter or a group of letters placed at the **end** of a word or at the end of a root to change its function; and sometimes to change its meaning.



The study of language and how it works.

# MORPHOLOGY

Morphology is the branch of linguistics that studies word structures, especially in terms of morphemes.

# MORPHEME

A morpheme is the smallest unit of a language that has its own meaning, either a word or a part of a word:

"Worker" contains two morphemes: "work" (**base word**) and "-er" (**suffix**).
