### Module Description

The course of English language is dealing with providing students with some of the specific language and skills that they are likely to need studying, human sciences in English. The course will also focus on English language appropriateness in different contexts, with an emphasis on formal, academic contexts. Therefore, the course aims to develop the communication skills and specialist English language knowledge of science students and professionals, enabling them to communicate more confidently and effectively in their work or study environment.

## Module objectives:

**For the purposes of the course, the skills of reading, writing, talking and listening can be further defined as:**

➤ **Reading**

- ◆ engaging with, considering, and selecting the main ideas of a text
- ◆ identifying and selecting detailed information from a text
- ◆ analysing and evaluating a writer's choice and use of language
- ◆ evaluating the overall effects and impact of a text

➤ **Writing**

- ◆ communicating detailed ideas
- ◆ communicating detailed information
- ◆ exploring, describing and communicating personal experience
- ◆ writing creatively and imaginatively in a literary form (for example prose fiction, drama, poetry)

➤ **Talking and listening**

- ◆ discussing and communicating detailed ideas and/or personal experience
- ◆ communicating detailed information
- ◆ using aspects of non-verbal communication
- ◆ demonstrating listening skills by responding to detailed spoken
