# learning diffuclties:

#### **Definition:**

- -learning diffuclties are an umbrela of disorders that occur frequently in children, where the child has difficulty understaning, speaking, or writing in any language. And on their performance in simple mathematical operation, and or coordination anbalance of movement.
- -It is a homogenous group of individuals within the classroom, with average intelligence who show disturbance in psychological processes and who have deficiencies in cognitive abillities, academic achivement, dyslexia.

# **Causes of learning diffuclties:**

lack of oxygen, during chiled birth, trauma to the head, Premature birth of the baby, child hood illness, accidents and genetics causes. undernourishment, infection during pregnency.

# **Developmental learning difficulties:**

Developmental learning diffucities are considred the first reasan for the emergence of academic diffucilties, they are related to cognitive processes such as thinking, memory, preception, attention, and language.

#### - Attention difficulties:

Children cant focus on one task for long, their focus get distracted very easly.they have dificulty in setting and organizing their time.refuse to do any tasks that require hight concentration and attention, such as solving problems.they have dificulty completing any assingnments.

# -perception difficulties:

It is inability to analyse and interpret information correctley.

It is a disorder in mental abilities that effect the ability to pay attention, fonction, focuses, receive information from the outside and intrepret it correctly.

### - Memory difficulties:

It is a children inability to retain and retreive information when needed, especially short term memory.

# -Difficulty thinking:

Children with difficulties face difficulties in thinking and analysis, as their minds lackthe organization of thoughts, and the inability to analyse the information that individuals receive, and they deal with matters in their overall form without their details.

# language Difficulties:

Signs that a child might have language disorder include: Trouble learning and using spoken and written language. Struggling to learn and use gestures. Difficulty with vocabulary, sentence structure or having a conversation. Having a hard time following directions or organizing thoughts.
