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## **How to Start an Oral Presentation in English**

In this TD, students will learn how to start an oral presentation in English in a clear, confident and natural way. The activity presents three different models of introduction, from simple to more formal, that can be adapted to any academic topic. Students are encouraged to practice each version, personalize it with their own topic and focus on fluency and pronunciation.

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### **Version 1:**

"Good morning everyone.

Today, I'm going to talk about [your topic].

I chose this topic because [give a short reason or motivation].

I'll first give you a brief overview, then I'll explain the main ideas, and finally, I'll conclude with some remarks."

### **Version 2**

"Good morning.

In my presentation today, I'll be discussing [your topic].

The purpose of this work is to [state objective or question].

My talk will be divided into three parts: first, I'll present the background; then, I'll describe the methodology; and finally, I'll discuss the main results and conclusions."

### **Version 3:**

"Hello everyone, and thank you for being here.

I'm excited to present my work on [your topic].

This topic caught my attention because [short motivation].

During the next few minutes, I'll walk you through the main ideas, some key findings, and what they might mean in practice."
