

# The pronunciation of “-ed”

1) Pronounced /t/.

Used when the verb ends  
with voiceless sounds: /p/,  
/k/, /f/, /s/, /ʃ/ (sh), /tʃ/ (ch).

<b>Verb</b>	<b>Past tense</b>	<b>IPA</b>
<b>help</b>	<b>helped</b>	<b>/helpt/</b>
<b>kiss</b>	<b>kissed</b>	<b>/kɪst/</b>
<b>wash</b>	<b>washed</b>	<b>/wɒʃt/</b>
<b>laugh</b>	<b>laughed</b>	<b>/læft/</b>
<b>cook</b>	<b>cooked</b>	<b>/kʊkt/</b>

# The pronunciation of “-ed”

## II) Pronounced /d/ .

Used when the verb ends  
with voiced sounds: /b/, /g/,  
/v/, /z/, /m/, /n/, /l/, /r/,  
vowels.

<b>Verb</b>	<b>Past tense</b>	<b>IPA</b>
<b>play</b>	<b>played</b>	<b>/pleɪd/</b>
<b>call</b>	<b>called</b>	<b>/kɔːld/</b>
<b>clean</b>	<b>cleaned</b>	<b>/kliːnd/</b>
<b>love</b>	<b>loved</b>	<b>/lʌvd/</b>
<b>beg</b>	<b>begged</b>	<b>/bɛgd/</b>

# The pronunciation of “-ed”

II) Pronounced /ɪd/ (or  
/əd/)

**Used when the verb ends  
with /t/ or /d/.**

Verb	Past tense	IPA
want	wanted	/'wɒntɪd/
need	needed	/'niːdɪd/
decide	decided	/dɪ'saɪdɪd/
start	started	/'stɑːtɪd/
add	added	/'ædɪd/
